Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

Return to School: Welcome back to all of our pupils and staff as we settle into the routines of another new school year. We hope that your child/children will have a very happy and a very positive experience in St. Ita's during this school year.

<u>School Policies:</u> Please see the school website on <u>www.stitasloughrea.com</u>. Please note that the following policies have been recently reviewed and updated – School Code of Behaviour, Special Education Needs Policy, Child Safeguarding Statement (including the Written Assessment of Risk).

Attendance and Punctuality: The school day runs from 8.50 a.m. - 1.30 p.m. for Infant pupils and 8.50 a.m. - 2.30 p.m. for pupils in 1st to 6th classes. Doors open at 8.40 a.m. so please ensure that your child comes to school on time. If your child is absent you must inform your child's teacher by note or email as we are obliged to keep a record of your child's absences and reasons for same.

Parent-Teacher Meetings:

Sporting Events:

- Co. Galway School Library Service visited the school in early September to facilitate a school library book exchange.

Numeracy:

- School Improvement Plan for Numeracy is being implemented.
- Infant Maths Trails.
- 6 Bricks is an initiative being introduced in Senior Infants 2 (Ms. Walsh's class). Through fun and short activities with sets of Duplo Bricks the children can practice their memory movement and creativity by using 6 bright coloured bricks. It is a hands-on engaging approach for learning through play with a focus on numeracy, literacy, motor skills and S.T.E.M.
- Plus Plus Bricks S.T.E.M. subjects and Aistear programme in Infant Classes
